PURPOSE	Provides need-based grant aid to help low- and moderate-income students afford undergraduate education and earn postsecondary credentials. See: Federal Student Aid Handbook	Extends Pell funding to short-term credential programs aligned with workforce demand to strengthen talent pipelines and address labor shortages. PROGRAM LENGTH ELIGIBILITY	Typically requires programs that meet federal academic year definitions, including degree programs and longer certificate programs aligned to academic year standards. CREDENTIAL TYPE	Accredited undergraduate degree or eligible certificate program offered by a Title IV participating institution. See: Federal Student Aid Program Overview	Industry-recognized workforce credential aligned with high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand occupations and approved through federal and state processes.	Enhancement: Workforce Pell prioritizes labor market relevance and employment outcomes.
STUDENT ELIGIBILITY – DEGREE STATUS	Must generally be enrolled in an undergraduate program and not have earned a bachelor’s or professional degree. See: Pell Grant Eligibility Guidance	Students may qualify even if they already hold a bachelor’s degree, provided they meet Pell eligibility and program eligibility criteria. See: Workforce Pell Policy Framework	Enhancement: Workforce Pell expands eligibility to adult learners and career changers.
FINANCIAL NEED REQUIREMENT	Must demonstrate financial need via FAFSA and federal need analysis (Student Aid Index). See: Pell Grant Overview	Uses the same FAFSA-based need analysis and eligibility framework. See: Federal Student Aid Eligibility Information	Alignment: Workforce Pell uses the same federal need determination model.
AWARD AMOUNT	Up to federal annual maximum (e.g., \$7,395 for 2025–26), based on enrollment intensity and cost of attendance. See: Pell Grant Award Information	Prorated based on program length relative to a full academic year; capped at cost of attendance and Pell eligibility level. See: Pell Grant Calculation Guidance	Enhancement: Workforce Pell award size is directly tied to short-term program duration.

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CONCURRENT PELL USAGE	Cannot receive Pell Grant funding from multiple institutions at the same time. See: Federal Student Aid Handbook	Cannot receive both traditional Pell and Workforce Pell simultaneously. See: Workforce Pell Implementation Announcement	Alignment: Maintains federal safeguard against duplicate awards.
LIFETIME ELIGIBILITY LIMIT	Limited to 600% Lifetime Eligibility Used (approximately six academic years). See: Lifetime Pell Eligibility Information	Workforce Pell counts toward the same 600% lifetime Pell eligibility limit. See: Federal Student Aid Handbook	Alignment: Workforce Pell integrates fully into existing Pell funding structure.
INSTITUTIONAL ELIGIBILITY	Must be a Title IV participating, accredited, and state-authorized institution. See: Institutional Eligibility Guidance	Same institutional requirements, plus program-level approval by state workforce authorities and the U.S. Department of Education. See: Workforce Pell Rulemaking Overview	Enhancement: Workforce Pell adds additional program-level approval requirements.
PROGRAM APPROVAL REQUIREMENTS	Institutional Title IV approval sufficient if program meets federal eligibility standards. See: Title IV Institutional Requirements	Requires approval by designated state workforce authority and U.S. Department of Education; must demonstrate labor market alignment and program performance. See: Workforce Pell Regulatory Framework	Enhancement: Workforce Pell includes structured workforce accountability and oversight.
OUTCOME AND EARNINGS ACCOUNTABILITY	Limited direct federal accountability tied to employment outcomes beyond general Title IV compliance. See: Federal Title IV Regulations	Programs must meet federal accountability and workforce outcome requirements tied to completion and employment outcomes. See: Workforce Pell Accountability Framework	Enhancement: Workforce Pell introduces employment and outcome-based accountability requirements.
WORKFORCE ALIGNMENT REQUIREMENT	No explicit federal requirement to align programs with labor market demand. See: Federal Student Aid Handbook	Programs must align with high-skill, high-wage, or in-demand occupations as defined by state workforce agencies. See: Department of Education Workforce Pell Information	Enhancement: Workforce Pell explicitly ties funding to workforce needs.
IMPLEMENTATION TIMELINE	Established federal program under the Higher Education Act; ongoing. See: Pell Grant Program Overview	Effective July 1, 2026, expanding Pell eligibility to short-term workforce training programs. See: Workforce Pell Implementation Announcement	Enhancement: Represents a major structural expansion of Pell into short-term workforce training.

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
